PASSAGE 1

The most vulnerable victim amid the hustle-bustle and rush of everyday life is our health. This is especially true of the health of Indian women who have to juggle multiple roles and face gender bias at the same time.

According to a 2013 WHO report, 5.37 lakh women were diagnosed with cancer in India in one year while further statistics say that 43 million Indian women are affected by heart disease. India, in fact, has the highest rate of malnourished females amongst underdeveloped countries. The figures are staggering and reflect India's poor record in the health sector.

The leading cause of death among women above the age of 65 is heart disease and heart attacks. Contrary to popular perception, women over 65 years of age are at the same risk as men. Women face greater difficulty in accessing public health services owing to their restricted movement. Unlike men, they are not encouraged or even allowed to go out of the house without permission from their families before venturing out even for medical purposes, and more so when the doctor is a male.

If numbers are anything to go by, nearly two thirds of health workers in the country are men. In rural areas, data reflects the stupefying incompetence of our education system and of the government in not being able to attract enough women to the sector. Only six per cent of female doctors in India work in rural areas.

These alarming facts proclaim that India desperately needs to reform its health sector and that the government must upgrade their system that claims to provide healthcare facilities to women. Despite registering high Gross Domestic Product (GDP) for more than decade now, India will not find itself in the club of developed countries unless it takes necessary significant steps in improving women's health

Even as women's health in the country continues taking a hit, 2020 saw more women health workers than men coming out to fight COVID-19. These are the same women whose health India ignored due to the ingrained patriarchal structure that Indian families thrive on.

We as a society are complacent about the woes of Indian women and though we continue to subject them to drudgery and burden them with disproportionate amounts of household chores, we have failed to provide them with adequate healthcare facilities. We conveniently turn a blind eye to their nutritional needs while an extra roti is served to a male member of the family. There is a huge social and cultural shift needed to introduce reforms, and this requires a push from the government to make the infrastructure more accessible to women.

The first was in 2017 when we got a short audience with him, where he advised against letting our emotions get the better of us. To wit, he said, "we are all too emotional nowadays, even the American President!", and laughing to himself, he moved on.

The second time was in early 2020 when I had an opportunity to ask him a question. This I used to ask about Maitreya Buddha, the future Buddha of loving kindness. I expected him to praise the value of hoping for a utopia rather than being cynical of the future. His answer surprised me; he said that such things were firstly not to be taken literally. Next, he said that when the present Buddha's teachings are still available now, why wait for another? 


